

PROCEDURES FOR RENEWAL OF OUT OF DISTRICT STUDENTS (2024-2025)

A student who resides outside the city limits of Scottsboro, but within the limits of Jackson County, is considered an out of district student and is subject to these procedures.

- The window for renewal applications for the 2024-2025 school year is <u>April 15th- through May 30th</u> for current Out of District students. Out of district applications may be obtained at the central office or on the Scottsboro City Schools website.
- Proof of residence must be provided to show Jackson County residency. Students of an employee are not subject to the provision that requires residency in Jackson County. <u>Any student not residing in Jackson County will not be eligible for enrollment.</u>
- In order to be eligible to submit an application for Out of District enrollment, all fees and outstanding balances (lunch/breakfast, club Wildcat, course fees, etc.) must be paid in full by **June 13th**. Applications may be denied if required documentation is not provided, application is not completed, and/or fees are not paid in full including tuition.
- Tuition is due with application. <u>All tuition must be paid in full to be enrolled in Scottsboro City Schools</u>. If your student is denied entry, your tuition will be refunded.
- Out of district applications must be submitted to the Central Office in the Page Administration Building to Ms. Corky Hood.
- The cost of tuition will be \$600 per year for the first student enrolled and \$300 per year for each additional student enrolled. Tuition may be increased at any time for the upcoming school year.
- All out of district students must submit an application each year they are in school.
- Students who move from the city limits during the school year will immediately be considered out of district and are subject to these procedures.
- Admission of out of district students will be based on availability and other factors as determined by the Superintendent listed on the application.
- Priority factors for enrollment include but are not limited to the following: (1) children of employees; (2) students enrolled the previous year; and (3) siblings of students enrolled the previous year.
- Tuition payment can only be submitted to the Central Office. Children of employees will not be assessed tuition.
- Current out of district students' attendance, discipline, and academic performance will be reviewed to determine eligibility for continued enrollment. (these will be pulled from Powerschool by the administrative team)
- Once accepted, an out of district student's eligibility **may be immediately** withdrawn during the school year for flagrant and/or persistent violations of the district's code of conduct, attendance policy, and other factors as determined by the Superintendent.
- Transportation services are **not** provided. Therefore, the parent or guardian is responsible for transportation to and from the assigned school. Any efforts to supersede this requirement will result in dismissal.
- Admission as a student does **not** guarantee athletic eligibility.
- After acceptance, parent/legal guardian will be expected to provide necessary documentation for enrollment to the
 assigned school. ONLY PROOF OF ALABAMA COURT APPOINTED GUARDIANSHIP OR AN ORDER OF
 CUSTODY GRANTED BY A COURT OF COMPETENT JURISDICTION WILL BE ACCEPTED AS
 DOCUMENTATION OF LEGAL GUARDIANSHIP. Due to the unique nature of circumstances, documentation
 requirements may vary as determined by the Superintendent.
- Beginning with the 2005-06 school year, students residing outside the Scottsboro City limits but within Jackson County shall be charged tuition. Tuition will **not** be prorated and is non-refundable. Any student enrolled as an out of district student prior to the 2005-06 school year or siblings of those students will not be charged tuition provided there is **no break** in enrollment. **Any** break in enrollment after the 2005-2006 year will negate the grandfathered status.
- First responders as defined by 34 U.S. Code § 10705 will not be assessed tuition for their children. This includes police officers, firefighters, and EMTS. Proof of employment will be required to accompany all documents.
